Madison County Schools students, teachers, and staff continued to promote academic achievement in the 2021-2022 school year as they dealt with the impacts felt from a global pandemic.

Madison County Schools scored a 60% level of proficiency ranking for all subjects and all students. This places us 13th in the state out of 115 districts. The state level of proficiency average was 51.4%. Schools throughout the district contributed to the above-average performance:

- All Madison County Schools are 9 points above the state average in grade level proficiency at all levels.
- Madison County Schools has no low performing schools under the North Carolina accountability model.
- Madison County Schools' **rank 1**st in the state of NC for the 4-Year Graduation Rate of >95%. The state's average graduation rate is 86.3%.
- Combined scores in all subject areas increased by 25.7 points in 2021-2022 compared to 2020-2021.

Even as state officials acknowledged the disruption to public education that students and staff faced over the last two years, Madison County Schools has continued to perform above state averages. Results for the 2021 - 2022 school year are not objectively comparable to previous years due to the many factors that came into play throughout the academic year.

The student achievement data for the 2021 - 2022 school year is based on analysis of all end-of-grade (EOG) and end-of-course (EOC) tests, which are aligned to the North Carolina Standard Course of Study in English Language Arts (Reading) and Mathematics and the Essential Standards in Science for all public schools in North Carolina.

Madison County Schools will continue to implement an intervention model of instruction at all schools to support student learning for the 2022 - 2023 school year.
