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“Madison County Schools has a motto of “Making It Happen” and that is exactly what they do, providing an amazing return on their community’s investment every year.” Dr. Jeremy Gibbs, Regional Director, North Carolina Department of Public Instruction.

Madison County Schools continue to perform well above the state average in areas such as Career and College Readiness, Grade Level Proficiency and 4 and 5 Year cohort Graduation Rate. Madison County Schools also saw a marked increase in academic growth in 2022-2023 with no low performing schools.

Madison County Schools scored a 61% level of proficiency ranking for all subjects and all students. The state level of proficiency average was 53.6%.

- MCS is **ranked 1st** in the state of NC for the 5-year graduation rate of >95%. The state’s average 5 - year graduation rate is 87.7%.
- MCS is ranked 3rd in the Western Region of NC for grade level proficiency
- MCS is ranked 10th in the state (out of 115 school districts) for grade level proficiency
- MCS Math Course Rigor is >95% (1st in the state)
- MCS ACT and WorkKeys assessment results scored above the state average.
