The students of Madison County Schools will have meaningful experiences and valuable academic preparation to ensure a brighter future.

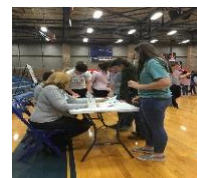
Madison County Health Department Director Provides Update:

Educators Tour Alabama Historic Sites: A group of educators from MCS toured Bethel Baptist Church and Sixteenth Street Baptist Church in Birmingham, Alabama. Both played key roles in Mass Meetings for the Civil Rights Movement alongside Reverend Shuttlesworth. Birmingham was the most racially divided city in the US and the site for the most racial bombings. The group also visited the home where Coretta Scott King grew up and the church where she and Dr. Martin Luther King were married, near Selma, Alabama.



Agribusiness Program Partnership: The A-B Tech Board of Trustees unanimously approved an Agribusiness Program partnership. The goal is to establish an Agribusiness Program at the A-B Tech Madison Campus which is integrated with the Madison County School's Agriculture Education Department! The goal will be for Madison Agriculture students to receive dual enrollment credit (Community College) by successfully completing Agriculture classes at Madison. We will initially establish an Agribusiness Certificate program and eventually an Agribusiness Associates Degree program to be housed as a signature program at the A-B Tech Madison campus.
