Early College Receives Grant: MECHS received funding from the Pigeon River Fund Grant with the help of Mountain Valleys Resource Conservation and Development and the Ivy River Partnership. MECHS portion of the grant will improve one of the detention ponds located on campus in addition to a pollinator, native species garden in the current traffic circle between the CSS and MECHS. These areas will serve as an educational piece to visitors and students using storm water management from the impervious parking area draining to the detention pond, planting native species to encourage insect pollinators and provide green space for our students to use as an outdoor classroom. Mrs. Oshen Wallin's Earth/Environmental Science students are excited with the opportunity to help with the design and implementation process.
