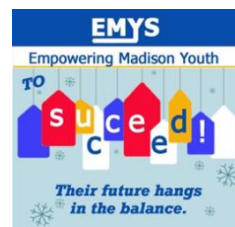
The students of Madison County Schools will have meaningful experiences and valuable academic preparation to ensure a brighter future.

MCS Special Called Meeting: The MCS Board of Education met in a special called meeting on Tuesday, July 16 at 4:00. The Board passed the final Local budget for 2019-2020 which added two K-3 teaching positions, made permanent the grant funded social worker position for Hot Springs and Brush Creek, increased the district employee supplement by \$100.00, allocates funding for the high school softball and baseball hitting facility, and a walking track and turf area for students at Madison Middle School. The Board also discussed the ¼ - penny sales tax and the results of a structural review of our countywide school athletic stadium by Kloesel Engineering. Engineers are requiring a 75-foot portion of our stadium to be condemned beginning with the 2019-2020 school year. While the stadium is over 45 years old, and in a state of decline, we have the opportunity to make improvements to our facilities for generations to come.
