The students of Madison County Schools will have meaningful experiences and valuable academic preparation to ensure a brighter future.

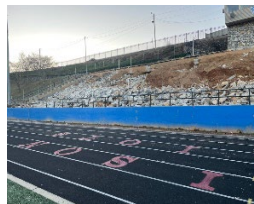
