When our students reached the evacuation location, staff continued to remain calm and support students, manage logistics (for four hours) while parents safely picked up their children. I again want to use the word heroic to describe our staff because in the moment when this occurred our staff had the self-awareness and courage to handle the "moment" and subjugate some of their own emotions, for our students. To me, that is heroism!
