Department for Making It Happen with our employee vaccination clinic!

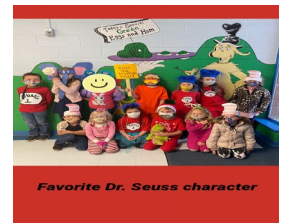
