Hands On Learning with Soil Slope:

Mr. Ayers' Natural Resource II class stepped away from the screen and learned hands-on applications of the mathematical principle of determining slope. Soil slope greatly affects land capability classes which significantly dictates best soil conservation management practices on agricultural lands. Soil is one of our most important non-renewable resources as it provides nutrients for plants which are essential to many organisms. It takes 500 years to naturally reproduce 1 inch of topsoil that without proper soil management, could be washed away quickly in heavy rains. 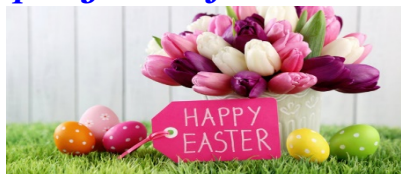


MMS Dance and Drama Performance:
