Teachers took a tour of the school and school grounds, learned about the extensive rehabilitation project to restore the building to the original condition, and the role this school played in educating

the children of Madison County during the segregation era (1905-1965). The Mars Hill Anderson Rosenwald School is a living example of history and has been placed on the National Register of Historic Places. The school will function as a lens on the past to teach our students about our local history and culture and the history of education in America.

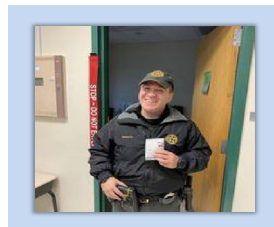
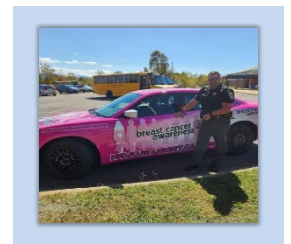
NHS Dance Arts Annual Event:
