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Tour of Schools: Madison County Commissioners and Board of Education members visited several schools March 3rd. We appreciate the collaboration with our county commission. We were happy to highlight a few of our most important initiatives within the district.



MHS AP Students Tour ARS: Thursday the AP Government class and students from the AP Human Geography class at Madison High School toured the Mars Hill Anderson Rosenwald school. Dorothy and Ray Rapp gave the students a brief history of the school. Sarah Hart, alumni of the school, gave the students a first-hand perspective of what it was like to be an African American student at the school in Madison County. The AP Human Geography students just finished a unit on segregation and political demographics. The AP Government students just finished their civil rights unit that includes a study of The Letter From Birmingham Jail, the landmark cases of Plessy v. Ferguson and Brown v. Board of Education. All of the students were engaged in what they were hearing and after the visit commented that they found the information very informative and eye opening. We are hopeful this will be the first of many trips to the school for the students at Madison High School.

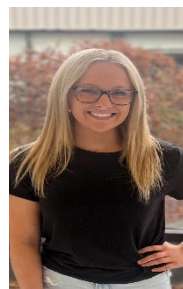
